

The Kibworth School: History Department Home Study Guidance

Overview

The following guide contains information about how to study History at home. The document aims to provide pupils with History lessons even though they are not in school. It also includes lists of important websites that pupils will need to use and how to find additional work should you want it. If you have any issues, the best way to correspond with your History teacher is by StudentFolder. During a period of home study, the History department aims to provide pupils with learning experiences as close to their lessons as it possible. This means that most KS4 work will be led by a PowerPoint and will contain activities and worksheets for pupils to complete. Pupils will also be provided with links to websites or scanned information from the textbooks to replace the knowledge that would be given to them by the teacher. This work will be set via StudentFolder in the first instance.

KS4

At KS4, pupils should use StudentFolder to access their lesson resources. Here they will find lesson resources as close as possible to those they would be study in class. Moreover, pupils might be asked to use any of the websites below to guide their study, or, indeed, they might be set discrete tasks using the websites themselves. The most important websites are:

Finally, pupils in Year 11 will also be sent revision material and past papers. It is essential that they are checking StudentFolder for this information where possible.

KS3

The work set for KS3 will be set via StudentFolder and will include PowerPoints, booklets, worksheets and activities for pupils to follow and complete. Pupils might also be asked to use the following websites to assist and extend their learning:
