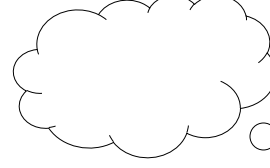
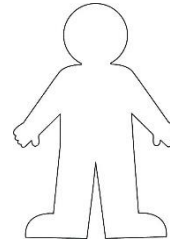


# Restorative Justice at Victim First

A voluntary process which offers you the opportunity to look at communicating between those involved in the incident to address the harm caused.

Harmed - Victim ← **Facilitator** → Harmer - Perpetrator

## Questions:

- What Happened?
- What were you thinking?
- How are you feeling?
- Who do you think has been affected?
- What needs to happen to move things on?

## Benefits to the school/community:

- Victim's voice heard
- Greater satisfaction with the process
- Gives a sense of a stronger community
- Increased safety as RJ has been found to reduce repeat offending
- Cost effectiveness

## Benefits to the victim:

- Have your voice heard
- Answers question you may have
- Helps draw a line under what happened
- Allows you to move forward with your life
- Helps empowerment and aids recovery and closure

## Benefits to the perpetrator:

- An opportunity to repair harm caused
- To do the 'right' thing
- Provide answers for the victim
- Allow offenders to make meaningful changes to their lives and move forward
