Proposed Poland Trip - October 2023

Dear Parent/Carer,

The Humanities Department are excited to be able to offer students the chance to participate in a residential visit to Krakow and Auschwitz. This is a fantastic opportunity for those students in Years 8, 9 and 10 who are currently studying, intending to study or have an interest in History. The trip will run from **9th October 2023 to 12th October 2023**, will have a specialist tour guide accompanying us for the entire trip and all meals will be provided.

On the first day, we will travel from school by coach to the airport, where we will fly to Krakow, Poland. After checking into the hotel in the centre of Krakow, students will then explore the city with our fully qualified tour guide to orientate themselves. Day two will include a guided walking tour of the Old Town, the Jewish Quarter and Schindler's factory/museum. Students will also visit the Galicia Museum to meet with a Holocaust survivor. Day three will be centred around a guided tour of Auschwitz and Birkenau Concentration Camp, before some supervised free time in Krakow Old Town. Day four will include a visit to Wieliczka salt mine (a UNESCO World Heritage site) before flying home. In order to maximise time, outbound flights will be in the early hours of Monday morning, with the return flight being on Thursday evening.

The total cost of the residential visit for 40 students, including accommodation, full board, flights and coach transfers and a specialist guide be **£650.00pp**. **This includes the initial non-refundable deposit of £150 needed to secure the student's place, to be paid by 24th October 2022.**

If all payments are not received in accordance with the payment schedule, your child's place may be withdrawn. Please note that this trip will only run if there is sufficient interest. If we do not have sufficient take-up in order to make the trip viable, all deposits will be returned. In addition, your child would need to have a valid passport, with an expiry date of 12th January 2024. In the event of there being any covid restrictions in place, we would expect your child to adhere to any local requirements at the time which may include stipulations such as being fully vaccinated.

Students wishing to go on the trip should return their completed slip from the bottom of the letter, to Miss Edgeworth (H4) by 14th October 2022.
